- 1. T-shirts have been made up as a fundraiser for the Flinder's EIU (Adults say "Someone I love has autism and children's say "Learning to learn-Flinders EIU, helping children with autism"). A number of people have bought them and will wear them to the walk.
- 2. Andrew Evans (Family First Party and MLC) is the only politician who has replied positive for the Walk and will speak on the steps (I haven't heard from Stephanie Key or Dean Brown yet). I met with Vickie Chapman just before Easter and she was very receptive to autism issues. I have also had supportive letters from Iain Evans and Tim Stanley.
